Catering Oil Leak or Spillage	Anyone Who May Come into Contact	 Any clean or dirty catering oil is to be kept in small clearly labelled oil drums. Full catering oil drums containing used oil are to be collected by licensed operators only. Deep fat fryers are kept well maintained to minimise any chance of leakage. Only a small quantity of used oil is kept in the work shop in well-marked containers. 	L
Light Pollution	Anyone Who May Come into Contact	 External lights to be kept to a minimum. All external lights are to be on automatic switches or timers. When New Barn is empty any possible lights are to be turned off using the main switches. When external light fittings are replaced LED lighting with sensors are to be used where suitable. 	L
Machinery	Anyone Who May Come into Contact	 Vehicles and machinery are kept in defined and locked areas where possible. Machinery to have working warning lights and horns. Machinery to be kept in a good and safe working order. 	L
Drainage	Anyone Who May Come into Contact	 All drainage is well maintained and checked regularly by MCD. Septic tanks emptied as required by licensed contractors. Any repairs are to be carried out as per local legislation. 	L
Wheelie Bins	Anyone Who May Come into	 Large refuse bins with lids are supplied in the car park for general waste. Recycling bins are also situated in the car park. 	L
